

Critique and Practice in Design and the Arts 2020-2021

Critique and Practice in Design and the Arts (CPDA) courses are designated as Arts, Design, or Either. Courses or course sequences addressing this concept must meet a majority of the student learning outcomes (SLOs). During the Spring 2021 semester,¹ Virginia Tech offered 54 Pathways courses that included the Core Concept of CPDA. Of those, 21 courses were approved as Arts, 23 courses were approved as Design, and 10 courses were approved as Either.




Figure 1. Arts (n=400); Design (n=2,013); Either (n=203)




Figure 2. Either (n=54)




Figure 3. Arts (n=114); Either (n=224)




Figure 4. Arts (n=426); Design (n=2,076); Either (n=120)




Figure 5. Arts (n=372); Design (n=2,053)
